



BRAND-Name Savings May Be Waiting for You!

Eligible patients who receive a XALATAN Savings Card* may find these tips helpful when picking up your XALATAN prescription.

Begin

at your doctor's office and ask if writing Dispense As Written (DAW)[†] is appropriate on your XALATAN prescription.

Remember to take the XALATAN Savings Card with you to the pharmacy.

Ask

your pharmacist for the XALATAN savings if you are eligible. Remind your pharmacist that your XALATAN Savings Card does not work with other products.

Notify

the pharmacist before you finalize your purchase if you did not receive the XALATAN you were prescribed.



forget to bring your XALATAN Savings Card, if you are eligible, each time you visit the pharmacy.

If you didn't get the BRAND-name savings that come with your XALATAN Savings Card, check to make sure:

- You received brand-name XALATAN in your prescription bag. Your card only works with brand-name XALATAN
- Your XALATAN Savings Card details were entered correctly
- Your pharmacist called 1-866-562-6147 for help processing the card for this brand

XALATAN is available by prescription only in 50 mcg/mL.
